

Franklin Pierce Law School seeks to hire a full-time, tenure-track faculty member to serve as Professor and Director of the Pierce Law Social Justice Institute starting in the Fall 2009. The faculty director of the Pierce Law Social Justice Institute will lead the SJI in building a community of students, faculty, and alumni/ae at Pierce Law who share a commitment to equal justice for marginalized and underrepresented clients and causes.
