

**Indiana University–Bloomington School of Law seeks a Director  
for its Nonprofit Legal Clinic**

The clinic was established to provide free legal services to the Indiana nonprofit community on issues such as nonprofit corporation formation and dissolution; officer and board member duties and constraints in governance; contractual agreements; relevant regulatory framework; Indiana and federal tax exemptions for nonprofit organizations; ethical issues related to representation of nonprofit organizations; employment matters in the context of nonprofit organizations; and the extent of allowable political activity by nonprofit organizations. NPLC does not handle litigation matters.

The Director plans, develops, and manages all aspects of the clinic. The clinic is offered each semester and has both classroom and practice components. Applicants should have excellent academic credentials, substantial teaching or practice experience, and a demonstrated commitment to training and mentoring. The Director of the clinic must be a member of (or eligible to be admitted to) the Indiana bar.

The Director holds a clinical faculty appointment in the School of Law, rank and salary commensurate with the candidate's background, qualifications, and experience. The starting date is flexible but will be no later than August 1, 2009.
