Founded in 1968, the Committee works with law firms in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area to address issues of discrimination and poverty. Widely regarded as having one of the country's premier non-profit employment discrimination litigation practices, the Committee's EEO Project utilizes the pro bono resources of the local bar to litigate employment and public accommodations discrimination cases on behalf of hundreds of clients. The EEO Project's work involves representing members of protected categories under federal and local law in both individual and class action litigations.
